A fresh greeting from Ken and Florence in Brisbane! This newsletter is our second issue in 2020 wrapping up the autumn season in Australia. As we have thrived through the ongoing health crisis (COVID-19), we would like to thank with a prayer:

Due to the health crisis, many students are facing various challenges: personal depression, study stress, family and financial issues. They need much emotional and spiritual support. We are walking with them and helping them cope with their problems by applying biblical principles. So we tailor different Bible materials according to their personal needs. Praise the Lord! Leslie a Returned student's Testimony

Leslie, an Ecuador student returned home a year ago. Florence discipled Leslie last year and continues to disciple her online this year. Below is Leslie's testimony:



“I graduated last year from UQ after living for 5 years in Australia. During my studies at university I was involved with the ministry of Power to Change. Due to this, my journey with God changed completely because I discovered that I can have a personal relationship with Him. I was so touched by God and his people in Australia in both my church and ISM. I grew so much in my faith and discovered that I can be part of a ministry. I went back to my home country Ecuador last August. Since then, I have to confront many challenges that came my way. It was difficult to adapt myself again to a different culture, people and society values in Ecuador. I struggled finding a job due to lack of job experience and networks. I had issues with my family, it was difficult finding a church, and sometimes I felt fearful due to lack of financial support from my family while searching for a job. It was definitely challenging but I thank God for two friends: one friend in Ecuador and Florence in Australia. These two people encouraged, advised and prayed for me. I think that God sent them during these difficult times.

I felt that all the things I did not struggle for 5 years in Australia, I had to face during these few months living in Ecuador. However, I had to learn to trust God in all the circumstances and continue putting my faith on Him. I had the opportunity to work for short periods of time in two jobs before the COVID-19. I was praying for a stable job that has a good salary and can be related to my degree. I recently received a call from a job I applied to, they are going to hire me, all the recruiting process was during the quarantine in my country. So, I can definitely say, this is a true miracle. Many people lost and are losing their jobs which is a very sad situation in Ecuador and other countries. But I was so blessed to be able to get a good job in the middle of all of this. God is answering my prayers, even when I have not been faithful. But He is faithful because when I am weak, He is my strength. I want to encourage you to trust God even in the most difficult times and please continue praying for international students returning to their home countries. Each of them is living a different situation, and it can be challenging when you do not have mature Christians around you. So please pray that they can find a church and continue growing in their faith because God is everywhere and he looks after all his children. Blessings from Ecuador."

Vicky a Graduating Student's Testimony

Since last July, Vicky has been coming to our activities. Florence has discipled her through the 1st and 2nd Steps programs followed by the Returnee Program. Vicky has



shared many situations manifested in her growth in faith. She has a heart to share the Gospel with her family, classmates and friends. For example, Vicky shared with her mum about life and death in a Christian perspective which made her Mum think about heaven when their family dog died.

Another example, Vicky invited her classmates to come home for a meal where she engaged in spiritual conversations and shared God's story with them. Vicky has demonstrated to find truth through the teaching in the Bible. She has experienced Jesus through the practice of prayer. Praise the Lord that she made a decision to be baptized before returning home.

Below is Vicky's sharing of her outreach experience: *"This is what I have experienced about God recently. I have talked to a lot of people about God lately. Some of them are non-believers and some of them are Christians. One thing that amazed me was, my classmate MJ has become a Christian but she didn't know about it herself. She joined the online church services a few times and was touched by the Word one day, so she followed the sinner's prayer at the end. Last time when I was talking to her, she asked me what to do to become a Christian and also shared this story with me. I told her that, as far as I know, you are a Christian already. How powerful God's word is!"*

In the Apr-Jun quarter, for health precaution against the coronavirus, we have been confined at home mostly for our ministry and work. However this has given us more time reading the Bible and reflecting God's word. While David has concluded the study of the Book of Habakkuk, Robindro and Luke will discuss new schedule with Ken in the next semester for further study in the Life of Jesus and PODS respectively.
- Pray for God's protection for our students and that they will grow in faith. While our current students will continue their study in semester 2 at UQ, pray for God's preparation for new students.
- Pray for the continual healing and ongoing protection from our merciful God to come upon the people against the infliction of COVID-19.
