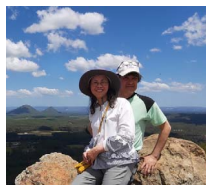
Be Strong and Courageous

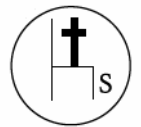
People reached
